Chairperson

The chairperson will head the club's board of directors. The chairperson will lead the club into the next phase of it's growth and development. Key responsibilities will be liasing with our current ground suppliers to ensure we continue to have safe and secure training facilities. The chairperson will also build relationship with the district and town council to ensure that the club is a major player when allocation of new facilities are agreed. The chairperson will also chair the monthly managers meeting.

The ideal person will have a mature outlook and a business background. Previous experience of dealing with councils and business and general red tape will be an advantage. Knowledge of the workings of a football club will be an advantage, although not a necessity.

Treasurer

The treasurer will report to the club's board of directors. The treasurer will be responsible for the financial well being of the club. Duties will include the taking and recording of subs at South End and the recording of subs taken at Rushden Community College. Paying in of monies collected and re-imburement of monies owed and invoices due. The treasurer will report on the club's finances at the monthly managers meetings, either in person or in writing.

The ideal person will have a financial background and be computer literate. Availability for duties at South End on Saturday mornings are essential. An ability to pass on information clearly and concisely is an advantage.

Welfare Officer

The welfare officer will report to the club's board of director's. The welfare officer will be responsible for ensuring that all adult coaches, officials and helpers at the club are up to date with current child protection legislation. The welfare officer will be the first point of contact for all coaches and parents regarding any child protection concerns. The welfare officer will be familiar with current legislation. The welfare officer will report on any matters

concerning coaches at the monthly managers meetings, either in person or in writing.

The ideal person will be approachable and sympathetic. Availability for duties at South End on Saturday mornings is desirable. An ability to pass on information clearly and concisely is an advantage. The ideal person will be computer literate.

For both the Treasurer and Child Welfare role Sue and Rachel, who currently fulfil the roles will stay in their posts to ensure that the transition between personnel is as smooth as possible.
